Water is Life

It's hard to say how much oil has been spilled in North Dakota. Oil companies claim that oil pipelines are safe. In 2012 and 2013 alone, 292 of 750 "oil field incidents" were pipeline spills. None of them were reported to the public. Earlier this month, electronic monitoring equipment failed to detect a pipeline rupture that spewed more than 176,000 gallons of crude oil in North Dakota. Yet oil company officials insist that it will be perfectly safe to run a pipeline under the Missouri River which supplies drinking water for millions of Americans. Native Americans have had



enough. On April 1, 2016, LaDonna Brave Bull Allard, an elder member of the Standing Rock Sioux tribe, established the Sacred Stone Camp to protect the water by protesting the Dakota Access Pipeline. They put out a call for help through Social Media websites and thousands of people, from all over the world, have joined them at the camp. Among them have been our friend Tawasi and his daughter, Serenity. Tawasi, who is one quarter Native American, has been involved in renaissance faires since the time he was a very young lad. He is now a social activist. He has been cooking breakfasts for thousands of people, splitting firewood, organizing and distributing donations, praying and freezing his ass off in sub zero temperatures accompanied by high winds. In addition, he has been keeping the rest of us informed of the truth of what's been going on in North Dakota through his posts on Facebook and YouTube. The mainstream media has dropped the ball and Tawasi is running with it. Congratulations or Condolences go out to Tawasi who we are very proud to honor and welcome as our newest

The Elliot Estate

A couple of hours after mailing out last Summer's *Abbot's Report*, our Abbot heard from Brother Love and Light (Jan Elliot). She and her husband, Ed, were selling their estate



on Renfaire Drive. For those who may not be aware, Renfaire drive and its offshoots comprise a community unlike any other, commonly known as Toon Town, Texas. Many years ago, when King George decided he no longer wanted people living in their shops at his Texas Renaissance Festival, he started selling lots on a road adjacent to the show. A village grew up there comprised almost entirely of rennies. Ed and Jan bought land there early on. Over the years, they built better homes and gardens and one of their buildings became the Toon Town Community Center. Their estate is very close to our Nuevo Chile Monastery. Last January, Brother Rio and the ladies of Nuevo Chile hosted a monastic retreat at Nuevo Chile. We discussed building an old rennies' home in Texas. *Abbot's Reports* are sent to more than forty monks who have Texas addresses. At the time of our retreat, the Elliot Estate had apparently been sold. We looked at another property in Toon Town and there seemed to be a lot of monks in favor of buying and building. Six months later, when the Elliot Estate once again became available,

we started a discussion on the secret BOOSM Facebook page. We were close to having the \$20,000 down payment and we were starting to find the twelve people we needed who could make annual \$1111 contributions to cover the upkeep and land payments. Then we came upon a problem that our Abbot had not anticipated. Although there were a couple of monks who would have liked to have lived on the property in the fall, while the festival was going on, we did not find any monk who would be willing to live on the property full time to take care of the homes and gardens. The Benevolent Order is a group of nomads. Ed and Jan ended up selling their estate to a couple named Eski and James who have four kids. The deal is set to close in mid January. We wish everyone smooth sailing with that real estate transaction. Although the Order did not buy this property, we learned some important lessons regarding revenue streams that are available for non profit organizations. We also made connections with two more people who know about writing grants—Sheryl Linn and Dave Dawson. The idea of the monastery/ old rennies' home is still alive and well, it is simply delayed.

Castleguard Renaissance Festival

We all work hard to make renaissance faires fun. Consequently, every year, we meet people who want to start their own renaissance faires closer to their own



homes. This year, Chris DeSmith thought it would be a great idea to open a renaissance faire in the Rio Grande Valley in Texas, near the Mexican border. December and January have traditionally been slow months for renaissance festival workers so lots of rennies jumped at the opportunity to fill eight empty weekends. DeSmith

bought and cleared forty acres of land. Tickets had been sold, there had been a little bit of advertising and hundreds of participants had arrived from all over the country. Friday afternoon before opening, a Hidalgo County judge revoked the mass gathering permit he had initially granted to Castleguard Festivals. The festival property was not on a public road and the people who had granted the right of way to drive to the land had not been told that the road was going to be used to transport hundreds of people to and from a renaissance festival. The Castleguard Renaissance Festival ended before it even opened. Rennies who had arrived hoping to make enough money to make it home or to their next show were left stranded. Another one bites the dust.

Bro RoMo Energizes Water!

Our Abbot recently had telephonic communication with Bro. RoMo (Ron Moses). Ron's son, Moses Rhane, has autism and Asperger's Syndrome. Although he has difficulties with social situations and schools, he is an avid learner and he has an excellent memory. He spends hours online at Kahn Academy studying various subjects and he and his Dad have taken an interest in the research and science of the Iranian physicist Mehran Keshe. Dr. Keshe has been developing free energy and anti gravity technology, so he has been ridiculed by mainstream media, doctors and scientists. He is disclosing information that the Powers That Were don't want us to know about. Keshe makes his teachings available for free on YouTube.
